Call for proposals – Web site development

Description of the project: Hapana Marefu Yasio na Mwisho" is a 3-year initiative focused on eradicating child marriage in Tanzania. Led by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT), the project collaborates with C-Sema, the organization operating the national child helpline #116, and Amani Girls Home, dedicated to advancing girls' rights and challenging harmful societal norms and values. Associates in the consortium are Lutheran World Federation, ACT Alliance, London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, Felm, Fida International and Tanzania Development Trust. Funding is provided by the EU. The project encompasses various activities, including advocating for legal reforms to combat child marriage, raising awareness among children to enhance their access to services, particularly within the Morogoro Maasai community, and mobilizing interfaith communities in Dodoma, Tabora, Morogoro, Mwanza, and Zanzibar to oppose child marriage both locally and nationally.

Brief Description of the Assignment: Visualization of video materials under the ELCT website (www.elct.or.tz).

Place of Assignment: anywhere in Tanzania, but more conveniently in Arusha or Dar es Salaam

Tentative Date of Commencement: 01 April 2024

Deadline for Applications: 15 April 2024, noon

Detailed Description: In 2024, the project aims to collect approximately 2000 video statements from religious and community leaders to bolster its advocacy goals of ending child marriage. These videos will be uploaded to the project's YouTube channel throughout the year. The scope of this assignment is to design and make a webpage under the <a href="https://www.elct.or.tz">www.elct.or.tz</a> website.



























This webpage will serve as a repository for these videos, providing links for easy access. Additionally, the webpage will visualize the scale of statements using elements such as maps, graphs and/or infographics. The link will be shared to interested parties such as press, government and other stakeholders. The system should be user-friendly, allowing the project team to update it as new statements are filmed and uploaded to YouTube throughout 2024. Webpage will follow the Hapana Marefu – project visual image.

We welcome proposals from web developers on how to best visualize the material. Also include a day for training the relevant programme staff for updating the website.

Contents of the proposal and weight in scoring:

- 1. Description of the visualization
- 2. How it can be updated (level of expertise needed)
- 3. How long time is needed to complete
- 4. Budget (design, web site development, training of staff)
