#### 1. BACKGROUND

- a. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT) focuses on propagating the "holistic" Gospel serving man through spiritual, social, economic and environmental programs /interventions in order to have a God-loving community hence fulfilling God's mission in Tanzania. Currently the Church coordinates Hapana Marefu Yasio na Mwisho; There is No Distance that has No End Project which is a 3-year project aiming to end child marriage in Tanzania through transforming positive norms, supporting girls at high risk and ending child marriage and change of the Law of Marriage Act (1977). The project is pushing for the changes of the law, awareness work for #116, mobilizing the interfaith community in Dodoma, Tabora, Morogoro, Mwanza, and Zanzibar to stand against child marriage within their communities and strengthened comprehensive services especially within the Maasai community in Morogoro. It is implemented by a consortium including the beneficiary, Cobeneficiaries, Affiliated and Associates. The project is Co- funded by the European Union with own contributions from ELCT and Felm.
- b. The project aims to achieve the following interlinked outputs: *Girls self-efficacy including ability to stay safe from child marriage through help-seeking is strengthened.* With this, the



intervention focuses beyond the intended activity of creating Morogoro a model region for preventing child marriages, also on ensuring that when creating more visibility for child marriage, the subsequent increase in help-seeking by girls at risk, will simultaneously ensure that the girls are aware of #116 and other support services. In doing so, this output also serves as part of risk mitigation plan (*increasing visibility of the harm of child marriage leads to increasing help-seeking by girls, but girls do not know where to look for help*). Knowing where to look for help is not adequate to end child marriage (nor FGM) if the norm around the acceptability of child marriage is not eliminated. Output 2 is: *Norms that condone and fuel child marriage are transformed through evidence-based strategies*. This output is adapting and translating material that has been newly developed based on ground-breaking research in Mwanza, to be used for specifically child marriage, and particularly combining it with material geared at interfaith leaders. Output 3 is *Interfaith actors are on the frontline in demanding and creating an enabling environment for a revised Law of Marriage Act in Tanzania* 

- c. Intervention logic: The action is designed to answer one of the most destructive norms affecting adolescent girls and women in the United Republic of Tanzania, the acceptability and legality of child marriage, and the lack of access to support services for girls at risk or already in union as children. This is especially the case in pastoralist communities where a multitude of harmful practices including FGM continue to be practiced, one of these areas is Morogoro
- ELCT seeks requests for application from eligible FBO and Women/Youth Led Organization.
  The estimated project duration is Nine (9) months form Contract signing date.

## 2. METHODOLOGY

The project cycle management of the Action is guided by <u>Human Rights Based Approach</u> (HRBA). In the project design, human rights are used as a basis for setting the priorities and objectives, which is in line with consortium members' values and principles, as all their actions are built on advancing human rights and addressing the root causes of marginalization and injustice. The Action facilitates the civil society's – notably young people, women and PwDs – understanding on their rights, entitlements and inform about public services and resources to participate actively on development policy dialogue and to make systematic claims on their rights. Similarly, the Action develops public authorities and other duty bearers' capacity to hold accountability and to respect, protect and fulfil the rights of the citizens, focusing on women and PwDs for equal inclusion – contributing to the governance, democracy, and the rule of law. The consortium members follow the Basic Operating Guidelines (BOG) in the implementation of the action.

The Action implements <u>Gender Equality and Social Inclusion (GESI) Approach</u> to include the most oppressed and marginalized communities and people groups. At the core of the Action is to



address the root causes of gender inequality and gender-based violence through a set of interventions that have been designed based on the <u>socio-ecological framework</u>, recognizing that behaviour change can be achieved through activities that target individual, interpersonal (family/peer), community and social/structural levels (Health Communication Capacity Collaborative, SBCC I-Kit). <u>Bottom-Up Approach</u> is applied to ensure the voices and real needs of the marginalized women groups are represented.

## 3. SCOPE OF WORK

ELCT is planning to involve FBOs, Women and Youth led organization in the implementation to make sure that the inclusion of women and youth belonging to minority religions who often face distinct forms of Othering are reached. The core idea is to capacitate the local community members and FBO/SCSOs to act as change-agents and to bring evidence from the grassroots to global arenas.

The specific scope is outlined below:

Awareness campaigns for increased understanding of the child marriages effects and mobilizing communities in pushing for a desired change

Support a communication campaign in Morogoro, Mwanza, Dodoma, Tabora and Zanzibar on the existence of 116 among rights holders including through visiting rural primary schools and community radio campaigns

Identify champion faith leaders and support them in peer-to-peer training to share experiences in ending child marriage

## 5. APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY

#### a. Faith Based Organization:

- i. One faith-based organization (FBO) to implement awareness campaigns or actions to end child marriage or norms and change values fueling them.
- ii. The organization should be registered as a religious organization under the Ministry of Home Affairs on the mainland or/and with the chief government registrar on Zanzibar.
- iii. The organization should have at least 400,000 members and strong media house to reach its members and wider audiences.
- iv. The organization should be outside the existing UNICEF and TIP supported faith leader statements so that the voice of religious leaders to end child marriage and to change underlying harmful norms and values is widened.
- v. It should have a proven capacity to implement inclusive adolescent projects and programmes in at least one project location.



### b. Women/ Youth Led organizations:

- i. Three women-led or youth-led or minority religious CSOs to implement awareness campaigns or actions to end child marriage or norms and change values fueling them.
- ii. The organizations should be registered at least at district/regional/national level as an NGO under the office of Tanzania National NGO Coordination of as a religious organization under the Ministry of Home Affairs on the mainland or/and with the chief government registrar on Zanzibar.
- iii. An organization is considered as a women-led if women hold the majority of key decision-making positions in the organization.
- iv. An organization is considered as a youth-led if young people under 25 years hold the majority of key decision-making positions in the organization.
- v. Religions outside Christianity and Islam are considered to be minority religions in the Tanzanian context.
- vi. The organization should have at least 3 years of experience to implement projects with proven track record to implement awareness campaigns or actions to end child marriage or norms and change values fueling them.

### 6. ADMINISTRATIVE & OPERATIONS
